CASE SPECIFIC SUPPORT SERVICES & REPORTING OPTIONS WITH THE SURVIVOR SUPPORT SPECIALIST



EMERGENCY ENGAGEMENT WITH THE PERPETRATOR OCCURS IF THERE ARE PHYSICAL SAFETY RISKS TO THE SURVIVOR

Medical Attention: The main reasons for getting medical attention after a rape are:

- medical care (post exposure prophylaxis - prevention of HIV, antibiotics for sexually transmitted infections, morning-after pill)
- a medical forensic examination (rape kit)
- report the crime to SAPS-FCS
- psychosocial support

Remember - by seeking medical assistance, you are not initiating a reporting process

SURVIVOR-LED PROCESSES FOR SUPPORT AT UCT

Complaint resolution options debriefing and counselling support is prioritised throughout the UCT Processes as requested by the Survivor

SURVIVOR CHOOSES:



UCT-OIC CONFIDENTIAL CASE REPORT ONLY:

Survivor or ally reports sexual misconduct complaint *survivor chooses

Survivor may choose: no further reporting processes or action against respondent

- A detailed statement is needed from the survivor
